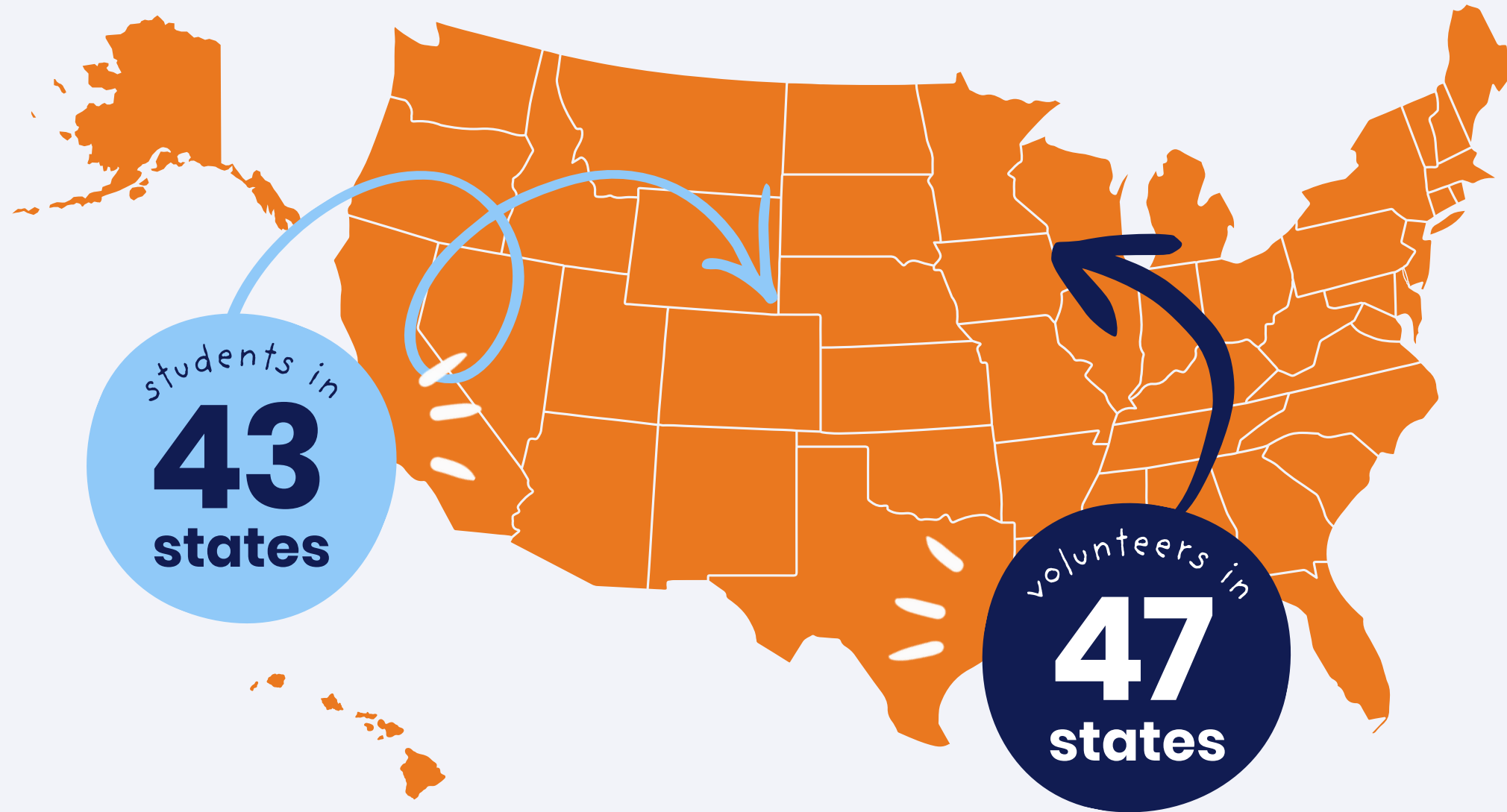

One-on-One Lessons offer free, adaptive lessons for kids and their siblings, matched with a volunteer for four weeks, in-person or online, with materials provided. **Last year 65.31% of CoachArt kids continued on with their same coach.**

CoachArt Clubs are four-week group lessons where kids build skills and friendships.

One Day Group Lessons provide short-term instruction for a group of kids who want to learn a new skill in a supportive social environment in person.

Our Night of Champions fundraiser launched CoachArt's NYC journey in 2025, raising support that **funded 972 additional hours of programming** ✨

That momentum led to our first in-person NYC event: a Scavenger Hunt at the Natural History Museum, where **CoachArt families and volunteers gathered locally for the very first time.**
